	Records review on 9/1/22, at 1:15 p.m., revealed that the last inspection from the City Fire Inspector was conducted in July of 2021. The facility had no documentation of a State Fire Marshal inspection in the 12-month period prior to the survey. An interview with Maintenance Staff A at that time revealed that the facility was aware of the requirement to be inspected on an annual basis and had two (2) prior inspections scheduled with the State Fire Marshal; however, the facility was unable to allow visitations during both scheduled times of inspection because of COVID-19.

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
